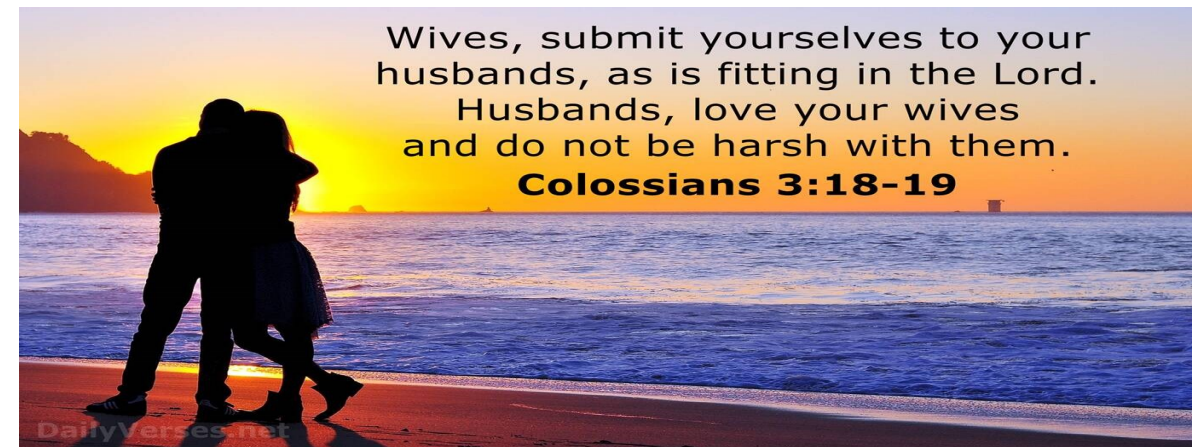

Redemption in Isaiah

Isaiah is a book of judgment and hope. Due to rebellion, idolatry, and injustice, of God's covenant people, God uses Persia to exile the people to Babylon and then to redeem them and bring them back. In chapters 40-48, hope and comfort are announced. The people are told the exile is over and they should return home where God will bring his Kingdom to Jerusalem and allow all nations to see his glory. Israel, instead of bearing witness to God, complains and accuses God of ignoring them. God responds to their accusations and states his purposes. In chapters 49-55, the "servant" is introduced and will fulfill God's mission. God calls him "Israel" and his mission is twofold; restore the people to God and become a light to the nations. He is empowered by God's Spirit to proclaim the good news. The servant will accomplish all this by being rejected, beaten, and killed by his own people. He will be the redemption of God. He dies, but he comes back to life giving people two choices; respond with humility, turn from sin, and accept what the servant did for them, or, reject God's effort.

Chapters 56-66 are where the servants, who choose to follow the "servant", inherit God's Kingdom. The New Jerusalem will be the place of God's justice and mercy and will flow out to the world. There are two long prayers of confession and repentance. In this new Kingdom, people from all nations are invited to join the servants in God's covenant family so they too can know their Creator and redeemer. Through the suffering of the servant king, God creates a covenant family with all nations awaiting the hope of a renewed creation and the coming of God's Kingdom.
